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N.C. High Schools Prioritize 2021 FAFSA Completion to Pave Way for Free or Affordable College for Students

myFutureNC announces winners of its inaugural FAFSA Challenge

RALEIGH, N.C. – Despite the challenges of the pandemic and remote learning, schools across North Carolina prioritized completion of the 2021 Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA, to help students pave a path to a free or affordable college education. myFutureNC, which is leading the state's educational attainment efforts to encourage schools, students and families to prioritize completion of the financial aid application. By completing the FAFSA, students become eligible for federal PELL grants, state need-based grants, scholarships, low-cost loans and work-study programs.

"FAFSA completion is a leading predictor of whether or not a student will attend college and graduate," said Cecilia Holden, myFutureNC's president and CEO. "The 2020-2021 school year was difficult for students and teachers, but schools across the state stepped up to the challenge by not only encouraging students and families to complete the application but also assisting them with what can sometimes be a difficult process. We are so proud of these schools' efforts, and those of our local community college partners who assisted as well."

Winners will receive a \$500 grant to support college access outreach and engagement efforts. myFutureNC has been lifting up schools' FAFSA completion efforts to create a college-going culture with a goal of moving the needle on college enrollment and completion.

For the FAFSA Challenge, the 499 participating high schools competed among similar schools by senior class size and location, in two categories. The 2021 FAFSA Challenge winners are:
